

MATH 1060Q EXAM 2 INFORMATION AND FAQS SP 2020

- When is the exam? Exam 2 will be given during your scheduled class time on Tuesday, April 7.
 - Why are you doing this? Because we know you all have many classes to juggle, by sticking to our regular class time, we can be sure that you don't have another class at the same time.
 - What if I can't take it then? If the current events mean you are unavailable at during the regular class time, please reach out to your course instructor or the course coordinator. We will work with you to come up with a solution.
- What resources can I use? Exam 2 will be open note. You may use any number of handwritten pages (written by you) as an aid on the exam.
- Can I use a calculator? Do I need a calculator? You may also use a calculator, but you should give exact answers, not numerical approximations to all questions. A calculator is not required, and we don't believe using it will help in any significant way.
- Is the exam proctored? You will be monitored via Webcam during the exam.
 - Why are you doing this? There are several reasons. One, this way if you have any questions while taking the exam, your instructor will be immediately available to answer them. Additionally, we believe the majority of students would not use non-allowed resources during the exam, with or without webcam proctoring. We don't want those students to be at a disadvantage when compared to classmates who might use non-allowed resources. The best way to keep things fair is to do our best to ensure all students are using only what is allowed.
 - What if I am not able to use a Webcam during the exam? Please reach out to your instructor or the course coordinator. We are happy to work with you to come up with a good solution.
- Do you have some tips for exam proctoring? Check the software your class is using in advance to make sure everything is working. You need to use a camera and a mic. We recommend you leave you mic on and turn the volume on your device all the way down so you aren't distracted by others during the exam.

- How will I get the exam? The exam will appear in HuskyCT at the beginning of your class time. If you have trouble finding it, just ask! (A benefit of the proctoring!)
- How will I write my solutions? Do I need a printer? You do not need a printer. You will write your answers on a sheet of paper. You should have several blank pieces of paper ready to go before the exam starts. Write each problem on its own sheet. This way you can do problems in different orders and come back as needed.
- How will I submit my solutions? You have 50 minutes to complete the exam. Your instructor will announce when time it up. After that, you have 20 minutes to submit your answers. You may start submitting early if you finish early. You must scan in your answers (using a scanner or, more commonly, an app that can use a smartphone to scan something to a pdf, like CamScanner, TinyScanner, or the built in functions in Google Drive, Dropbox, Apple Notes, etc.). Then you will upload your solutions to the Assignment where you found the PDF of the exam.
- What if I don't know how to submit answers? We will do a sample with this week's quiz. But again, your instructor is right there, via Webcam. Just ask!
- I have CSD accommodations. Can I still use those? Yes, please reach out to CSD to discuss the options with them. You should also contact your instructor.
